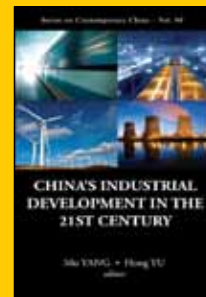
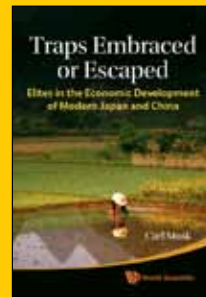
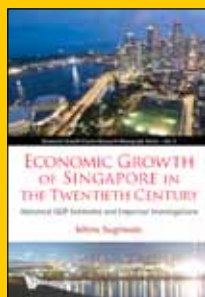
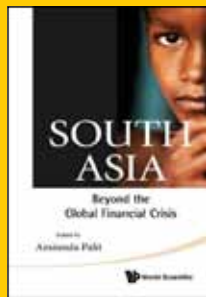
THE HANDBOOK OF MICROFINANCE

The *Handbook of Microfinance* showcases an expansive collection of works from leading academics and field practitioners.
