

Rocco Ungaro was born in 1943 in Anzi (Potenza, Italy) and studied Chemistry at the University of Parma, where he graduated in 1968, writing a thesis on the isolation and characterization of natural products. In 1974/75, he was a postdoctoral fellow at the State University of New York (SUNY) in Syracuse (New York), working with Prof. Johannes Smid on crown ethers and ion pairs. From 1971 to 1982 he was a lecturer, from 1982 to 1986 an associate professor, and since 1986 he has been a full professor of Organic Chemistry at the University of Parma. Prof Ungaro is one of the pioneers in developing the chemistry of calixarenes and promoting their use in supramolecular chemistry. His current research interests concern the chemistry of aromatic compounds, as well as the design and synthesis of new molecular receptors for biologically relevant species and calixarenes.
