

**Drew Fudenberg** began his career at UC Berkeley, where he was tenured at the age of 28; he then taught at MIT, and moved to Harvard in 1993, where he is currently the Frederick E Abbe Professor of Economics. Fudenberg is a Fellow of the Econometric Society, and a past member of its Council; he is also a member of the American Academy of Arts and Science. Fudenberg was the editor of *Econometrica* from 1986 to 2000 and has served as associate editor for *Games and Economic Behavior*, *the Journal of Economic Theory*, *the Quarterly Journal of Economics*, and *Theoretical Economics*. He is the co-author of *Dynamic Models of Oligopoly* (with Jean Tirole), *Game Theory* (with Jean Tirole) and *The Theory of Learning in Games* (with David K Levine). In addition to the work collected here, Fudenberg helped pioneer the use of modern game theoretic analysis in industrial organization, and the study of non-equilibrium learning. His current research interests include bounded rationality, contract theory, evolutionary game theory, non-equilibrium learning, and repeated games.
