Biography:

After completing her M.Sc. degree, in 1939 Harradence won an 1851 Exhibition Overseas Scholarship. The other scholarship, of the two awarded annually among the six Australian Universities existing at that time, was won by her future husband (Later Sir John Cornforth) who was one year behind her at Sydney. They both chose to use the Scholarships to work for their D.Phil. degrees at the University of Oxford. The pair worked together at the National Institute for Medical Research (NIMR) first at Hampstead, then at Mill Hill, from 1946 to 1962, and subsequently at the Milstead Laboratory of Chemical Enzymology (Shell Research Ltd.). They published 41 papers in collaboration, their first joint research, at Oxford as Medical Research Council scholars, was on the chemistry of penicillin; then at the NIMR they addressed the biosynthesis of steroids from mavalonic acid and fundamental studies of enzyme stereochemistry, leading to the award of the Nobel Prize in Chemistry for 1975 to Sir John Cornforth (jointly with Vladimir Prelog). In his Nobel Lecture, Sir John paid tribute to his wife's pivotal contributions to their joint work: "...with patience and great experimental skill [she] executed much of the chemical synthesis on which the success of the work was founded". Harradence never received any formal recognition for her contribution at the time. She retired in 1975, and was awarded an honorary doctorate from the University of Sussex in 1976. The Australian National University at last gave her recognition by setting up the Rita Cornforth Fellowships for women scientists.

Biography:

Kidson was born in Christchurch, New Zealand, and her father, Charles Kidson, was an accomplished artist and sculptor who taught at the Canterbury College School of Art, while her mother, Kitty Ester Hounsell, had some training as a teacher entered Canterbury College in 1923. Following her father's death in 1908, her mother moved the family to Nelson. Kidson excelled at high school, gaining a Junior Scholarship which enabled her to begin studies at Canterbury College in 1923. She was awarded the Sir George Grey Scholarship and the Haydon Prize in chemistry and, in addition, she became an expert swordswoman.

After working for two years as a demonstrator in chemistry at Canterbury College, Kidson worked for a time for the New Zealand Refrigerating Company at Islington, near Christchurch. In 1931 she joined the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research and was seconded to the chemical staff of the Soil Survey (at that time part of the Geological Survey Branch). She worked at the Cawthorne Institute in Nelson, where soil chemists were involved in a survey of the volcanic soils of the central North Island. Kidson, working in collaboration with H.O. Askew and J.K. Dixon, perfected highly sensitive methods for the determination of trace amounts of cobalt in soils and plants. Her meticulous and skilled chemical testing showed conclusively that lack of cobalt in the soil was the cause of the serious wasting disease in sheep and cattle that occurred in volcanic areas of the North Island and in parts of Nelson and Southland.

Kidson remained at Cawthorne Institute for 34 years. She became a world leader in the research into magnesium deficiency in apples, and did extensive work of the vitamin C content of fruits, the relationship between calcium deficiency and the disease bitter pit in apples, and the link between mineral constituents and nutritional diseases in tomatoes. Her research was of fundamental significance to horticulture and, especially, to the fruit-growing Nelson region.

Kidson was the sole or part author of over 44 scientific papers and in 1952 was awarded the degree of D.Sc. by the University of New Zealand in acknowledgement of the quality of her work. She spent time in 1937 and 1954 working at research stations in Britain, and in 1952 was awarded a travel grant to make a study tour of the United States. She was the first woman Fellow of the new Zealand Institute of Chemistry in 1943, and was elected Fellow of the Royal Institute of Chemistry in 1944 – the first New Zealand woman to achieve that honour. In 1963 she was awarded the Fellowship of the Royal Society of New Zealand.

When she retired in 1965 Elsa Kidson was able to develop her interests in art. She studied sculpture at the Wimbledon School of Art in London and on her return to New Zealand became a proficient and imaginative ceramist and sculptor, displaying skill at sculpting life sized heads of children. Her knowledge of art and chemistry combined in her unusually glazed and decorated clay works. She was involved in the Nelson branch of the New Zealand Federation of University Women, and the Nelson branch of the Royal Society of New Zealand.
