Lakeman was the daughter of Horace Bradlough Lakeman, excise officer. While at Bedford she was president of the League of Nations Union (Bedford College Sub Branch). In 1927 Lakeman was living at 37, Culverden Avenue, Tunbridge Wells, Kent. During 1926 to 1928 she did supply teaching in England and France, then, during 1928 to 1932, was a research worker with Dr. Otto Oberlander a consulting chemist. In 1932 Lakeman moved to the London Electric Wire Co where she was chief works chemist until 1934. From 1934 to 1936 she was coaching students and revising the Dictionary of Applied Chemistry. By 1938 Lakeman was a Librarian and Information officer to the Research Association of British Flour Mills, before joining the W.A.A.F. in 1941 to serve as a radar operator. In 1945, she contested the General Election in 1945, as a Liberal candidate for St Albans and again in 1950 in Brixton, London. Lakeman retired as an editorial consultant for the Electoral Reform Society and received an O.B.E. for her public and political services.

Muir, daughter of a senior administrator in the Indian Civil Service, grew up in India. After reading chemistry at Oxford, she moved into the field of biochemistry at the William Dunn School of Pathology, first as a graduate student and then as a research fellow. In 1948, Muir accepted a position at the National Institute for Medical Research, Hampstead undertaking research in porphyrins. Next moving to St. Mary's Hospital, she commenced work on osteoarthritis, the field for which she became world famous. During the 1950s, Muir investigated the chemical composition of joints and ligaments, discovering the proteoglycans molecule, which prevents tissue from being compressed by acting as a shock absorber. As part of her studies, she showed that an injury in athletes could trigger the onset of the disease. In 1966, Muir moved to the Kennedy Institute for Rheumatology in Hammersmith as Head of Biochemistry, then in 1977, she became Director of the Institute, a position she held until she retired in 1990.

Her work was published in a wide variety of journals and she was on the editorial board of the *Biochemical Journal*, *Annals of the Rheumatic Diseases*, *Corrective Tissue Research*, and the *Journal of Orthopaedic Research*. Among her enormous number and variety of awards, Muir was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society in 1977 and she was made a Commander of the Order of the British Empire (CBE) in 1981. She was the first woman to serve on the council of the Medical Research Council (1973-1977).

According to the Obituary in the *Telegraph*: "A fiery, striking-looking redhead of forthright opinions and a great zest for life, Helen Muir loved fast cars and fast horses, and rode to hounds with the Bedale, near her family home in North Yorkshire. She forged her career in the male-dominated world of medicine and biochemistry with the same sort of no-nonsense determination as she cleared fences on the hunting field. ... Her enthusiasm for hunting indirectly provided material for her research. She would frequently return to London with packages containing the legs of old hounds, which she would analyse in her laboratory. The accurate diaries kept by the huntsmen, detailing the work the hounds had done, would enable her to assess how their bones had been affected by the wear and tear inflicted during their working lives."
