Tomkinson was the daughter of Michael Tomkinson, carpet manufacturer, of Franche Hall, near Kidderminster, and Annie Stonehouse, and she entered Girton College in 1911. Between 1916 to 1919, she was an analytical chemist at Messrs. Stewarts & Lloyds, Ltd., Halesowen, Birmingham. Tomkinson then returned to Girton as Assistant Lecturer in Natural Science until 1921 when she received a Girton College Travelling Fellowship to undertake research work with Prof. Paul Sabatier, at the University of Toulouse from 1921 to 1922.

In 1923 Tomkinson began a variety of teachings posts in schools until 1939, as well as occasional Inspector of Secondary Schools for Board of Education from 1930 to 1939. During the Second World War Tomkinson was a F.A.N.Y. ambulance driver, 1940 to 1942, before joining Imperial Chemical Industries, (I.C.I), Metals Division, as an analytical chemist, assistant and later head chemist, at their Summerfield Factory, near Kidderminster until 1945 .

Biography:

Kerridge entered University College as a student in 1919 and upon graduation, she joined the staff. In 1931 she was appointed Lecturer in Physiology and Biochemistry and then in 1934 Lecturer in Physiology, Pharmacology and Biochemistry. Her research work was extensive and involved many other institutions, including the Marine Biological Association of Plymouth, the Physiology Laboratory at Cambridge, the Carlsberg Chemical Laboratory of Copenhagen, the Medical Unit of the London Hospital, and London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. Her work on the use of the hydrogen-ion glass electrode in biochemistry was probably her greatest claim to fame. During the Second World War, she was seconded to the Emergency Medical Service as assistant pathologist at St. Margaret's Emergency Hospital, Epping. Her illness and death cut short her promising career.
